


# Commissioner Valeche to Speak at January Association Meeting

# **PBCE Landowners Meeting Minutes**

Nov 13, 2018 7:30 PM

36 landowners were also present and cookies were served. Meeting started with Pledge of Allegiance.

PBSO REPORT: PBSO Deputy Russell reported there were 2 stolen cars from the same address. The thief had the keys to one car and keys to the other were in the garage. This was part of a domestic dispute. There were 2 tags reported stolen or lost from vehicles and 2 vehicle burglaries where both cars were unlocked at the time. PBSO recommends that you keep you cars locked at all times and remove any items of value especially weapons. Deputy Russell thanked the members of the local PBCE COP (Citizen Observer Patrol) unit and encouraged additional volunteers.

Vazquez from the US Postal Service and there was a detailed discussion and report on the problems facing mail carriers. There were many issues but the major concern is the lack of proper street numbers in front of each house that are easily readable both during the day and at night. Mr. Vazquez helped people sign up for "informed delivery" and promised to schedule a meeting with the local Postmaster and the manager of the Palm Beach Gardens post office to further

discuss delivery issues. Questions and answers followed the presentation. Jay Morris, a PBCE resident, spoke about his recent installation of a Solar Energy System for his home. John Winsker from Advance Solar & Energy also spoke about the advantages of Solar power for homes and provided some hand-out information.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** A copy of the detailed income & expense statement was available on-line and at the sign-in desk.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** The minutes of the September meeting were published in the newsletter and copies are on the sign-in table. There were a number of handout sheets also available regarding various issues for PBCE residents.



Also thanked were Tiffany Kilby and Debbie Trapasso for the great turn-out at the Halloween night Trick-or-Treat event where some residents reported 40+ children at their doors.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Valerie Rozzo presented the campaign for SOS (Save-Our-Sidewalks) whereby the Association is attempting to raise the funds necessary to repair and maintain the sidewalks. The initial immediate goal is approximately \$3,000 of which over \$2,300 was pledged at the meeting. More than \$12,000 will be needed for annual maintenance.



We need volunteers to help those who are organizing the events. There are all kinds of opportunities to help before or during the event. We know everyone is busy but just a small amount of your time will make a world of difference.

## NEW VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR COP



The COP (Citizen Observer Patrol) program in Palm Beach Country Estates is desperately in need of additional volunteers. The COP program is part of the Palm Beach County Sheriff Department. PBSO provides the training, uniforms, vehicles, fuel and maintenance for the vehicles. In return, PBSO asks that we provide enough volunteers to patrol at least 100 hours a month for each of the vehicles. Palm Beach Country Estates previously had three (3) vehicles assigned to this area. However, there are now only two (2) because of the lack of use. There is one Ford

Focus and one Ford Escape. Volunteers are asked to provide at least 12 hours of volunteer time each month and attend a monthly meeting. This is a "see and be seen" program. Just the presence of the COP vehicle patrols with in the Palm Beach Country Estates community over the past 9 years has very significantly reduced the incidents of crime and mischief in the community. Volunteers can choose anytime at all to patrol. The cars are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for patrol use. To volunteer for the program or to obtain additional information, please contact PBSO volunteer services division at 561-433-2003 and tell them that you are interested in volunteering for the Palm Beach Country Estates area program. You can volunteer as a driver or as just an observer. Please help with this very important community program.



#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW WHEN YOUR LOT FILLING


After the historic rainy season we had this summer, I'm sure you are looking forward to some cool days and dry conditions. You may even be thinking about what to do with those low spots on your property that were underwater for most of the summer. Of course, the obvious solution is to bring in dirt and fill in the property. However, before you start ordering material, please be aware that filling may cause the un-intended consequence of displacing water onto adjacent properties, or into the South Indian River Water Control District's commonly-managed drainage system, thereby potentially reducing water storage, flood control and water quality treatment for all landowners.

For a developed piece of property, you are allowed 20 cubic yards of fill for every one acre-size lot over a 24-month period. Twenty yards of material is approximately one truckload. Projects in excess of 20 yards require a permit from the County. A permit is also needed for filling or excavating a pond.

In addition, any fill operation affecting more than one acre must also comply with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) regulations (Section 27, Article VII, PBC Code), which are intended to improve the quality of stormwater discharges into the stormwater system and to increase public awareness of all stormwater discharges.

These are just a few policies set forth by Palm Beach County related to lot filling and grading activity. Violations of this policy may be subject to Code Enforcement citation under the Florida Statutes. 
