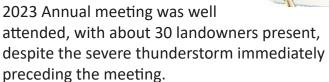

Sheriff's Report: Deputy Keith Russell led the pledge of allegiance and gave the crime report. In May there was one night where there were 14 vehicle burglaries and 6 attempted car thefts. ALL the vehicles were unlocked and the 6 cars had the keys in the vehicles. Through the diligent efforts of the PBSO and using the new camera system installed, within 48 hours after the crimes PBSO had identified the suspects and their vehicles and found their location. All the stolen cars were recovered along with one other unreported stolen vehicle. According to PBSO, the quick identification would not have been possible without the community cameras.

New Business: The results of the election were announced. All incumbent positions were unopposed for re-election so the positions of President, 2nd VP and Treasurer remained the same. However, 2nd VP Suzanne Colton will be moving and resigning at the end of May. At least one potential landowner expressed interest in the position. The remaining board members may appoint a landowner to the position. Debbie Trapasso reported on the plans for the 4th of July

event. All the vendors are confirmed. We expect a record turn-out this year.

Old Business: There was lengthy discussion regarding the potential for sound walls along the turnpike. Suzanne Colton was heading a committee for that purpose and Greta Foriere agreed to take over that effort. A landowner reported that there appears to be a new round of code enforcement activities prompted by another landowner who had been cited for a violation and is now reporting other landowners. If code enforcement gets a complaint, they have an obligation to investigate. Bob Berman reported that there has not been any additional activity regarding the attempt by a few landowners in the Acreage to allow semi-tractor trailers in AR zoning districts. He will continue to monitor the topic.

Treasury Report: Treasurer April Lundgren gave the financial reports and stated that all financial information is posted on the web site www.pbce. org and anyone with any questions was free to contact her. The annual meeting adjourned. Additionally, after the annual meeting, the board appointed Greta Foriere as 2nd VP to replace Suzanne Colton effective June 1st.

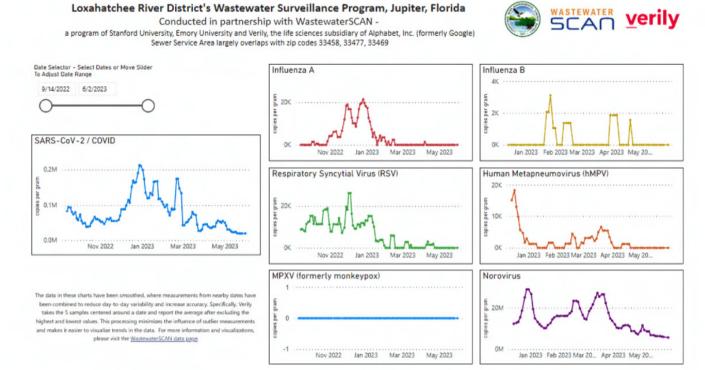

Loxahatchee River Environmental Control District Update By Kevin L. Baker, Governing Board Member

Loxahatchee River Environmental Control District https://loxahatcheeriver.org/provides an important service to our community by testing the sewage entering the plant for levels of Covid, flu, and other illnesses. The good news is that illness levels in the District covering Jupiter and Tequesta are way down.

In May, the wastewater surveillance monitoring for the Biobot/CDC and WastewaterSCAN programs show that the concentrations of SARS-CoV-2/COVID, Respiratory viruses RSV and hMPV, and Norovirus have all declined, following the winter "flu" and other illness season.

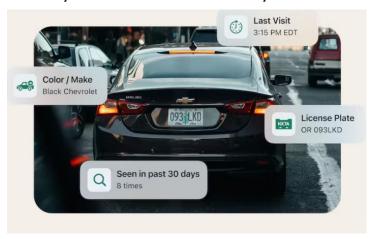

THE CAMERAS ARE WORKING!!!!

Early in May of this year there were a series of burglaries and auto thefts in the neighborhood where more than a dozen cars had items stolen from the vehicles. ALL OF THE VEHICLES HAD UNLOCKED DOORS. There were also 3 stolen cars. This all happened in one night. Very quick action was taken by the Palm Beach County Sheriff us-

ing the FLOCK cameras that were installed by the Palm Beach County Landowners last year. Within 48 hours, the Sheriff was able to identify the criminals and their vehicles, track the criminals to their home locations in southern Palm Beach County, recover all of the stolen vehicles, and even locate another stolen vehicle from another area that was unreported. Along with diligent detective work on the part



of the Sheriff, the FLOCK cameras provided extremely information that will be used in prosecuting the cases. Landowners \$50 annual contribution has made these cameras possible and they have dramatically improved the security of the neighborhood.
